<u>Housing FAQs</u>

* Was I charged a Security Deposit at move-in?

- No, we do not require a security deposit for housing. We do require a pet deposit of \$250, which is refundable at move out per no pet damage. Also, you are required to pay a prorated rent amount at move-in, while your BAH is being set up.
- * If I retire while living in housing, can I continue to stay in my home?
 - You are allowed to stay 30-days after your official retirement date. You must prepay for that month since we will not be receiving your allotment.
- What type of payments do you accept?
 - In office, we ONLY accept check and money order payments. You can pay using a debit or credit card online at our RentPayment.com website. We do not accept cash. (**Pet deposits must be paid in office via check or money order, no exceptions**)

What is required if I want to vacate housing?

We require a 30-day written notice to vacate that is completed at the Shaw Family Housing Management Office. If you are unable to provide a proper 30-day notice, you must provide proper documentation as to why; such as short notice orders.

WINDOW SAFETY checklyst

veather and the urge to open ow pose a potential danger any people don't realize until late – **window falls.**

check all the ro your home and make sure they are safe places for your children to play or nap.

- Teach children about the hazards of playing near an open window and make sure they understand that a screen will not stop them WARNING \checkmark and make s from falling. CHILD FALL HAZARD
- Never put beds or other furniture under a window.
- Do not allow children to stand on toys or other items to look out a window.
- Routinely check your screens to make sure that they are secure and if you have concerns please call maintenance. Remember: SCREENS DO NOT PREVENT FALLS.
- Check the cords on your blinds and other window-coverings to make sure they do not pose a choking hazard. Cords should be less than 8 inches long when the blind is in the closed position. Keep cords up, out of the reach of small hands. Make sure all cords are free-hanging and are not looped or knotted.
- If you require additional safety measures for your windows, please inquire at your local Hunt Residential Management office.



Maintenance Corner



WHATYOU SHOULD KNOW

A nationwide study published by the American Academy of Pediatrics n 2011 reviewed hospital visits by children injured by falling from a window. «The study found:

- 25% of the children required admission to the hospital.
- 2.20, of the children required admission to the hospital.
 4.20, of the children were male.
 4.85, of the children sustained head or face injuries.
 4.01, diano 0.4 years old ware more ikely to sustain head injuries.
 4.01, children 0.4 years old ware has 5.6 times more ikely to also be hospitalized due to a window fall than olderchildren.

WHATYOUCANDO

- Close it! Close upstairs windows if an unaffended child will be in the room.

- Litise to Calce uprises windows if an unamended child will be in the room.

WHAT KIDS SHOULD KNOW

- WHAT KIDS SHOULD KNOW Kids can't fift itses the importance of being safe around windows. Dan't push mei Children should never push or lean againt a screen or window frame. Teach them that a window screen will not stop them from falling out of the window. Dan't cross the line! Edis should never lean or neach out an open window. Teach them to never neach across or climb on the window ledge.
- Don't monkey around there! Climbing is fun on the playground but can be dangerous nearstairs or an open window.
